Marriage Minute: Do you have unrealistic expectations about what marriage is supposed to be like? Of course we have a right to expect certain things from our spouse, such as time attention, affection and help. But we can get into trouble when we expect things that aren’t reasonable. For instance: You can not expect that he can fix things (because your dad did). You expect her to keep the house as clean as she did before you had 3 kids. You expect your spouse to react the way that you would, even though he is a totally unique person! These expectations “tie up heavy burdens” for our spouses to shoulder. Many of our marriage enrichments teach skills that help spouses approach these expectations in a healthy way
